1. Undergraduate fees

1.1 Home / EU fees

Full-time students

The funding of University undergraduate courses comprises two elements of which the most significant is the income provided from Central Government funds allocated through the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE). The second element is in the form of a contribution to the costs of education from, or on behalf of, each full time undergraduate student.

Part-time students

The fees for students undertaking part-time courses have been set in direct proportion to the full-time fee and therefore will depend on whether the student is either a new entrant or continuing. The rates which apply for 2008/09 are provided below. All undergraduate courses are modular for 2008/2009. Standard modules are allocated 15 credits. Some modules carry different credit weightings and fee bands where the following charges apply:

Bursary scheme for undergraduate students

Years 1 and 2 – full time

Students who are eligible to claim the maximum means tested grant will receive a statutory bursary of £tba. In addition to this entitlement, a new bursary scheme is available to new entrants which links eligibility to residual family incomes as determined by LEA means-test assessment, and which takes into account the proposed student support arrangements from 2006.

Details of the scheme are as follows:

Residual income Band / £	Bursary offered (inc. statutory bursary)
0 – 1,000	1000
1001 – 25,000	600
25,001 – 39,305	310

Students can also apply for the compact scheme which is designed to encourage the progression of students into higher education from local colleges. The eligible students will receive £300 for each year of the course in addition to any entitlement to the University bursary.

Students studying foundation degree courses in Business Administration and Education Early years are not eligible for this scheme.

Years 1 and 2 – part time

Students can apply to the Student Funding Service for a bursary. Where certain conditions are met, a flat rate bursary of £250 is available to students studying 60 or more credits in any one academic year.

NOTES

1. Students repeating a full-time or part-time course without attendance, except to sit examinations, or submit dissertations/projects, will be charged a flat rate of £153 irrespective of the number of modules. Students returning to repeat final teaching practice on ITT courses will be charged £tba.
2. All students undertaking repeats of a course with attendance, either full- or part-time, will be charged on a modular basis or the equivalent full-time fee.
3. Discounts may be available to part-time students aged over 60 at the time of enrolment. Further details are available on request from the Finance Department.
4. An INSET rate, for full-time teachers, may be available on certain courses within the Faculty of Science. More details are available from the Finance Department.
5. Additional charges, such as materials charges may be applicable on certain courses. Details of these are available from the relevant Faculty Student Office.
6. Normally, residency status (e.g. Home or Overseas) once approved will be retained for the duration of the course.
7. Please note that the fees shown in this leaflet reflect the standard rates of tuition fees that may be applied to each course of study, and are not intended to represent an exhaustive list of all the fees that may be applied.
