

## Federal Disclosure Requirements: Gainful Employment Programs

In accordance with Federal Regulatory Citations, institutions are required to provide the following information for each program that leads to gainful employment:

1. Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) codes
2. Cost of the program to include books and fees
3. Placement rate for students completing the program
4. On-time graduation rates
5. Median loan debt incurred by US students who have completed the program

<sup>1</sup> The UK does not operate the same system of credit and clock hours as US institutions. However, 10 credits usually equate to 100 hours of study. Modules of study in one academic year equate to 120 credits.
