MSc in Historic Building Conservation

The School of Surveying & Planning runs an RICS accredited MSc in Historic Building Conservation. This is intended for those who are already working in a related field or who have a qualification in a related discipline and who want to specialize in this area. The course is delivered either over two year part-time or one year full-time.

Topics covered during the course include:

- Materials
- Building Pathology
- Regeneration
- Economics of Conservation
- Legislation
- Analysing and Recording of Historic Buildings
- Design and Historic Environments

Overseas field trips are integral elements of both the undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. We also organize numerous site visits. Some project-based activities are centred around on-going works at the Historic Royal Palaces.

Students also undertake a dissertation and deliver a conference paper based on the dissertation at RIBA to complete the MSc.
