Kingston University's School of Surveying & Planning runs an undergraduate programme in Historic Building Conservation in partnership with the Building Crafts College, Stratford, London.

Topics covered during the course include:

- IT and Graphical Realisation
- History of British Art and Architecture
- The theory of conservation and its relation to the Construction Industry
- Health, Safety and Welfare
- Remedial Works and Traditional Techniques
- Measurement and Analysis of Condition
- Heritage
- Historic Building Materials
- Building Control

Students also have the opportunity to undertake work-based and workshop-based projects in addition to a final dissertation.

The Foundation Degree is delivered over two years at the Building Crafts College at Stratford, East London, with the third year top-up to BSc(Hons) level, at the School of Surveying & Planning at Kingston University.
